Give Your Ten Cents Worth

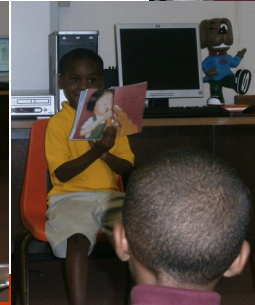
